Kapunda Liberals hear about health

At the Kapunda Liberal Branch dinner held last week at the North Kapunda Hotel, members and visitors heard from the Shadow Minister for Health, the Hon Stephen Wade MLC, and local General Practitioner, Dr Max Van Dissel, on concerns they have for the future of Health services in South Australia.

Dr Van Dissel spoke eloquently on his experiences in country medicine over many years and commented that, due to the current Labor Government policy, there has been a downward spiral in provision of funding to country health facilities, resulting in many services being cut and skills lost in country areas.

Dr Van Dissel is currently Vice President of the SA Division of the Liberal Party, and in that capacity, has been actively speaking across South Australia outlining some of the health service issues in rural and regional areas.

Said Dr Van Dissel, "I am pleased to have

been involved over a long period in the local Kapunda Medical Practice, which is a continually expanding enterprise, meeting the needs of the local residents, both in Medical and Allied-Health areas.

"This health service may not have happened if not for the foresight of the Kapunda Hospital Board members in the 1980s, who took a gamble in providing suitable infrastructure

to attract more medical services to the area. The local board recognised the need and acted upon it. The current Practice is testimony to their vision."

The Hon Stephen Wade endorsed Dr Van Dissel's remarks and outlined the policy of the Liberal Party, should it be elected to government in March 2018.

Mr Wade revealed that a lack of funding for country hospitals

and facilities by the current government had led to severe challenges to meet the needs of patients and residents.

Some facilities had only managed to continue through the generosity of private donors who had stepped in to fill funding shortfalls.

The Shadow Minister praised Country General Practitioners like Dr Van Dissel and lamented the decline of younger doctors being

prepared to take on a country practice.

He commented that South Australia does not seem to have tackled this challenge as well as other states in Australia.

Mr Wade thanked local Member for Stuart, Mr Dan van Holst Pellekaan, who had been invaluable in providing information and support from across country SA on existing health facilities and needs of country residents.
