"Our Barossa factory is in an old country shed, but we have invested \$30 million on plant and technology and the success of this investment is dependent on the strength of the Barossa wine industry," John said.

apprentices who are learning a profession and a skill, and we see The Barossa Cellar as a legacy opportunity to ensure they can build long-term careers and stay in the Barossa well beyond their apprenticeships."

Peter urged everyone to get involved in The Barossa Cellar now to ensure the posterity and success of the Barossa wine community for many generations to come.

"It's exciting to see the engagement this project has already fostered amongst mum and dad producers, wineries, members of the community and local and national companies," Peter said.

"There really is a way for everyone to be involved, whether it is by donating a stone for the building, or a vine in the vineyard. This gives donors a piece of ownership of

the project and is a unique opportunity that many would give their left arm for."

The Barossa Cellar is still seeking donations to fully finance construction and fit-out of the building which is taking shape on Stockwell Road at Vine Vale. Donor categories begin at \$500 for a stone, or \$1000 for a vine, and range to key categories of greater value, for which donors receive several additional benefits.

All donors will have access to The Barossa Cellar and will be acknowledged on a permanent display within the building and on the website.

**COUNCIL ELECTIONS**

**Close of Rolls**  
**Friday 10 August 2018**

You are entitled to vote in the November 2018 council elections if you are on the State electoral roll.

You need to complete and return an electoral enrolment form by 5pm Friday 10 August if you have recently:

- turned 18; or
- changed your residential or postal address.

You may provisionally enrol if you are 17 years of age. If you turn 18 on or before the close of voting for council elections at 5pm on Friday 9 November 2018, you will be enrolled to vote.

Electoral enrolment forms are available from your local post office or online at [www.ecsa.sa.gov.au](http://www.ecsa.sa.gov.au) or [www.aec.gov.au](http://www.aec.gov.au)

If you are not eligible to enrol on the State electoral roll you may still be eligible to enrol to vote if you own or occupy a property. More information about eligibility and enrolling to vote for council elections is available from [www.lga.sa.gov.au](http://www.lga.sa.gov.au) or by contacting your council.
